I was listening to KCBS while driving through San Jose today and was surprised to hear the statistics given by a <u>Kids and Cars</u> representative regarding backover accidents. According to Kids and Cars, a non-profit "working to keep children safe in and around motor vehicles", California has the <u>highest</u> <u>incident of backover accidents</u>. There are many factors that contribute to this startling statistic including the higher, heavier, bigger vehicles popular in this area and our busy, multitasking tendencies that can lead to inattention.

<u>Kids and Cars</u> is working to bring awareness to these unnecessarybackover injuries and deaths. Sadly, "most backover incidents occur in a residential driveway or parking lot and involve a parent or other close relative." With focus and attention, these accidents can be reduced. Other ways to help reduce the chance of a backover accident include:

- 1. Keep landscaping trimmed along your driveway.
- 2. Instruct your children to not play in driveways.
- 3. As you enter a parked car in a driveway, look around to see if there are any children nearby.
- 4. Always check your blind spots and mirrors before backing up.
- 5. Use your rear-mounted camera if you have one, but do not rely on this alone to alert you to dangers.
