CENTERPOINT MEDICAL CENTER PARTNERS WITH KIDSANDCARS.ORG TO REMIND PARENTS TO LOOK BEFORE YOU LOCK™

As summer heat kicks in, a timely reminder of the dangers of forgetting a child in the car — so far 13 toddlers from across the country have died this year, a preventable tragedy.

WHO: Atif Ali, DO, Emergency Medicine, Centerpoint Medical Center and KidsandCars.org will remind new and expectant parents and caregivers about Look Before You Lock child-car safety program.

WHAT: Leading up to National Heat Stroke Prevention Day the end of July, Centerpoint and KidsandCars.org demonstrate a powerful program to gain awareness of accidentally leaving children in cars during hot weather, often when new parents are distracted and unaccustomed to having a child in the car's backseat.

WHEN: 1:30 p.m., Wednesday, June 25, 2014

WHERE: Centerpoint Medical Center, 19600 E. 39th St., Independence, MO. 64057

WHY: Heat stroke is the leading cause of non-crash vehicle fatalities for children 14 and younger who die from a preventable tragedy. Often a new parent, unaccustomed to having a baby in a car's backseat, is distracted and accidentally leaves the child in the vehicle. Centerpoint Medical Center is partnering with KidsandCars.org to offer new and expectant parents and caregivers a safety education program.

A parked car can reach 125 degrees in minutes, even when the windows are partially open. Children are especially vulnerable to heat stroke, as their body temperature rise three to five times faster than an adult's. Atif Ali, DO, Emergency Medicine, says partnering with KidsandCars.org is a natural. "We want to help gain awareness for a very real and unnecessary tragedy — leaving a baby in a car. We're teaching new and expectant parents and caregivers the habit of always opening the back door of their vehicle every time you reach your destination to check to make sure no child or pet has been left behind and to keep a large stuffed animal in the child's car seat."

Dr. Ali and Amber Rollins of KidsandCars.org, along with a mother and her four-month-old son, will demonstrate how, right before the child is placed in the seat, moving a stuffed animal to the front passenger seat is a visual reminder that a child is in the back seat.
